Positions requiring election are: Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Chaplain and one Trustee. No member may hold two elected positions. See, Sec. 215, VFW By-Laws.

We encourage our new members to consider elected office or seek the appointed offices of Adjutant, Service Officer, Judge Advocate, Officer of the Day or Surgeon. The nomination and election processes are set forth at VFW Manual of Procedure (MOP) 217, and the duties of the elected/appointed officers are set forth at VFW Manual of Procedure (MOP) Sec. 218.

Remember: If you're shy about asking someone to nominate you, you can nominate yourself. Nominees may accept a nomination in person at a meeting or by submitting a written acceptance.

COURT DECIDES BLUE WATER NAVY VETS ELIGIBLE FOR AGENT ORANGE BENEFITS: A federal court ruled in January that Vietnam veterans who served on ships offshore during the war are eligible for benefits to treat illnesses linked to exposure to the chemical herbicide Agent Orange. The government could seek a review of the case from the U.S. Supreme Court. 50,000 to 70,000 veterans could now become eligible for benefits. POTENTIAL NEW BRAIN SCAN TECH FOR TROOPS WITH PTSD: A California company is combining old and new technology to try and help the military cope with post-traumatic stress disorder. San Diego-based Baslyne partnered with medical technology company WAVi to measure the strength and quickness of the brain's response in members of the military. Together, the companies are using an electroencephalogram (EEG) to measure brain activity, combined with a specialized test to measure response to various tones. While this technology has been used to understand concussions in young athletes, Baslyne's CEO Tom Kinder said they are now using it to understand PTSD in the U.S. military.

This sort of tech may develop into pre-deployment testing to create a benchmark for post-deployment testing. This could greatly assist in expediting disability claims, which often are denied by the VA because of lack of stressor evidence inducing the PTSD.
