Prior to our Dec 13 meeting, the Post held its Award Ceremony for the winners of our 2018-19 Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen Youth Essay Contests at the Highland Park Police Dept. Training Room. In attendance were Chris Brennan, Cmdr Dave Kunz, Sr Vice Cmdr Greg Detlie, Joe Heim and QM Quilici.

Our winners were: VOD 1st Place-Sara Perl (Highland Park HS); VOD 2nd Place-Hannah Frazer (Highland Park HS); VOD 3rd Place-Molly Selligman (Highland Park HS); Pat Pen 1st Place-Alexandrine Harig (St. Mary's School, Lake Forest); and Pat Pen 2nd Place-Emma Kunz (Woodland middle School, Gurnee).

The winners, their families and friends and school personnel attended the ceremony. Cmdr Kunz congratulated the contestants and distributed the award prizes and winners' certificates.

Our 1st Place winners now advance to the Fifth District competition,

which will hold its Award Banquet on Jan 12, 2019 at VFW Post 4551 in Antioch. Our Post will be notified shortly before the District Banquet if either or both of our VOD or Pat Pen winners won a 1st, 2nd or 3rd at the District. Then the 1st Place District winners will advance to the Department (State) Competition, which will hold its Award Banquet in Springfield, IL on Saturday, February 9, 2019. THE TWO THINGS THAT WILL DEFINE IL STATE GOV'S VIEW OF VETS: The smoke has cleared. On January 14, J. B. Pritzker takes office as the 43rd Governor of Illinois. He is a Democrat, and both the IL House of Representatives and Senate are controlled by the Democratic Party. The Two Big Things IL veterans should be watching insofar as determining the State's view of vets are: the Quincy Illinois Veterans' Home and the unfinished Illinois Veterans' Home at 4250 N. Oak Park Ave. in Chicago.

As you know, the Quincy Home's ancient water system contributed to the death of 13 veterans from Legionella. Supposedly, the State will replace the outdated structure. Also, the 4250 N. Oak Park Ave. Chicago facility broke ground in 2014, but construction ceased because, according to reports, it was being built based on the Chicago Bldg Code instead of the Illinois Bldg Code, which supposedly is more restrictive for earthquake protection. Many residences and other structures in the area were built according to the Chicago Code, and they are doing just fine.

The Two Big Things and how they are handled in the coming spring construction season should let us all know how we stand with IL State government. Money is tight, but Gov-elect Pritzker made promises to do right by veterans. We'll see.
