WHY WE WORRY ABOUT NORTH KOREA: This month's NewsGram includes an obit for Life Member James R. Fleming. LEGIONELLA BACTERIA AT THE SPRINGFIELD CAPITOL COMPLEX???: As you all are aware, Legionnaires Disease has killed 13 people at the Quincy IL veterans' home operated by our fiscally irresponsible and insolvent state government. And despite the state spending \$6 million to upgrade Quincy's water system, this fall, three more residents tested positive for legionellosis, including one who died.

Now we learn that preliminary test results show the possible presence of Legionella bacteria in the Illinois Capitol Complex's hot water system and officials have removed aerators and shut off the showers to reduce the possibility of infection. (Chicago Tonight website, 01/22/2018). Quincy is a bit over 100 miles from Springfield, and both communities have some old government structures dating back to more prosperous times. Checking the Capitol Complex made sense.

But now what? Legislators are supposed to meet again this month regarding Quincy's water system and now the Capitol Complex system may join the agenda. But the Governor is required to present a budget in mid-February, and Illinois statewide primary elections take place on Mar 20. Remember the last Illinois budget fight? And Illinois is considering a \$107 billion bond sale to save its insolvent pension plans. (Chicago Tribune, Jan 30, 2018). There's no money left for anything.

Comrades, over the last decades we have seen how veterans have been made the Evening Special at the Road Kill Café by both the federal and state governments. The federal government, currently, seems inclined to improve the veteran environment, especially concerning the Veterans Healthcare Administration. But federal mid-term elections in Nov 2018 may bring that to a screeching halt.


We, at the Post level, will need to be more vigilant regarding the welfare of our aging and needy Comrades because probably there will be no one else to do it.

(Further info on events available on VFW Natl/Dept websites, gen internet search or contact QM Quilici) **SAME DAY URGENT CARE SERVICE AT VA????:** On Jan 12, 2018, the VA announced that:

"100 percent of its more than 1,000 medical facilities across the country now offer same-day services for urgent primary and mental health-care needs. Same-day services means a veteran with an urgent need for primary care and mental health-care receives services that may include: a face-to-face visit with a clinician; advice provided during a call with a nurse; a telehealth or video care visit; an appointment made with a specialist; or a prescription filled the same day, depending upon what best meets the needs of the veteran."

That's a bold statement for an organization that appears to be having trouble meeting its staffing needs. Recent staffing problems were reported in the on-line Stars and Stripes on Jan 17, 2018 in relation to the new VA Medical Center in Aurora, Co. And there are VA staff vacancies in TX as reported in the Nov 30, 2017 San Antonio Express-News. And there is a mental care provider shortage at Chicago's Jesse Brown VA Med Ctr as reported by the Chicago Tribune on Feb 2, 2018. We could go on and on and on.

And what about the 15 underperforming medical centers identified by the VA on Feb 1, 2018 as having a one star out of five rating which are in need of immediate intervention? See, VA on-line press releases. One wonders what same-day urgent care looks like at these facilities.

Perhaps, the VA will manage what it considers an "urgent need," which probably differs substantially from the rest of the medical community. In any event, there appears to be a disconnect between the VA's press releases and reality.
